

# Denver Health Residency in Emergency Medicine Residency Interview Logistics and Important Dates 2021-2022 Applicant Cycle

---

In accordance with the Coalition on Physician Accountability (COPA), the Council of Emergency Medicine Residency Directors (CORD), the Emergency Medicine Residents Association (EMRA), the Society for Academic Emergency Medicine (SAEM) Clerkship Directors in Emergency Medicine (CDEM), and local guidance from the University of Colorado and Denver Health's Graduate Medical Education offices, we will adhere to the following policies for the 2021-2022 application cycle:

- Interview invitations will be released according to the Unified Interview Release Date
  - Interview Invitation Offers Sent - Wednesday, October 20th 6pm EST
  - Interview Scheduling Opens - Thursday, October 21st 6pm EST
- We will only offer interviews for the number of interview slots that we have available. Every applicant who is offered an interview will be able to schedule and complete an interview
- Applicants will have a minimum of 72 hours to accept or decline an interview invitation prior to that interview being offered to another applicant. Applicants will be notified if their interview invitation is no longer active
- All interviews will be conducted virtually
- All applicants will receive a notice of final status by Friday, December 17th at 6pm EST
- All interviewers will participate in implicit bias training
- There will be no in-person residency sponsored events. Applicants are welcome to visit Denver, but should not request or engage in person with either residents or faculty

## Denver Health Residency in Emergency Medicine Important Policies:

1. Per hospital, Policy Denver Health Medical Center only supports J-1 Visas.
2. Proof of ACLS certification is required before you begin clinical shifts at Denver Health Residency in Emergency Medicine. If training was not provided by your medical school, Denver Health Medical Center will reimburse you up to \$100.00 to obtain your own training before coming to starting residency
3. Documentation of the following immunizations are required before your first clinical shift:
  - a. Annual Step 1 PPD, Step 2 will be placed at orientation
  - b. Varicella documentation or positive titer results
  - c. MMR documentation or positive titer results
  - d. Tdap (can be done when you get here)

- e. Mask Fit (can be done when you get here)
- f. COVID Vaccination

4. All new residents will need to obtain a Colorado Training License before your first clinical shift
5. All new residents will need to obtain an NPI number before their first clinical shift
6. Health insurance coverage begins July 1st, 2022

- Unified release date that applicants will receive an interview offer is **10/20 at 6pm EST**
- Unified release date where applicants can schedule their interview is **10/21 6pm EST**
- Residency application deadline is **November 30<sup>th</sup>**
- Last day offering interviews is **December 17<sup>th</sup>**
- Match day is **March 18<sup>th</sup> 2022**
- Intern Welcome Dinner is **June 6<sup>th</sup> 2022**
- Intern Orientation is **June 6<sup>th</sup> - June 18<sup>th</sup> 2022**
